



In the Nootka Sound region, home of the Mowachaht/Muchalaht, you can meet direct descendants and experience the culture of a people who trace their roots back into the mists of time. They were one of the few indigenous peoples on the Pacific Coast who hunted whales. Whaling was central to their culture and spirituality, and is reflected in stories, songs, names, family lines, and numerous place names. You can visit the site of a 4300 year old village and walk the beach where Captain Cook first met Chief Maquinna in 1778. Some 200 years later the Mowachaht/Muchalaht joined other western Vancouver Island Indigenous people, and became known as the Nuu-chah-nulth, meaning "all along the mountains."
